1 Now I would remind you, brothers, of the gospel I preached to you, which you received, in which you stand, 2 and by which you are being saved, if you hold fast to the word I preached to you—unless you believed in vain.

3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the Scriptures, 4 that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures, 5 and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 6 Then he appeared to more than five hundred brothers at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have fallen asleep. 7 Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. 8 Last of all, as to one untimely born, he appeared also to me. 9 For I am the least of the apostles, unworthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. 10 But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but the grace of God that is with me. 11 Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed.

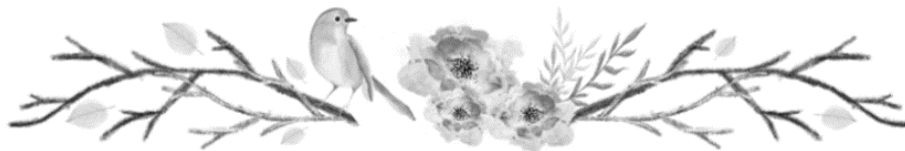

Two Skunks In A Trap.

Scamper scrams to freedom. Why? Freedom beckons; hunger bids.

Camper remains. Why? Disbelief? Disorientation? Shell-shock? Defend his space? Dig his way out?

WE Are Like The Trapped Skunks

Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me (Psalm 51:5).

The heart is deceitful above all things and beyond cure. Who can understand it? (Jeremiah 17:9).

I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I keep on doing (Romans 7:19).

Trapped By Name *your* traps.

I won't believe it unless I see . . . (John 20:25).

Your own doubts? Paralyzed by fear? Shamed into inertia by guilt? A grudge? Doubts about your future? Resentments from the past? Disbelieving that you really are trapped—or really free/

Determined to work your own way out. Comfortable with life in the in the trap?

Angry at the one who trapped you?

The Trap Door Is Opened. Jesus sets you free. What does freedom look like to you?

The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor.

He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives (Luke 4:18).

The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom. (Mark 10:45).

For the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost (Luke 19:10).

You seek Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has risen; he is not here. See the place where they laid him (Mark 16:6).

You Are Free--Free to Live Unhindered and Serve Unlimited. Where do you need to be freed up?

For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery (Galatians 5:1).

Whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these (John 14:12).

What's Keeping You In The Trap? What keeps you down?

They were afraid. . . .they would not believe it. . . . they did not believe (Mark 16:8, 11, 13).

Doubt, sin, fear, not knowing the Spirit's power, love and self-discipline; the power of the resurrection? Guilt, greed, bitterness, envy, strife, or anger?

Jesus stands outside the tombs where we languish, inviting us to life, calling us to courage, heading us for heaven, offering us the Spirit. *Behold, I stand at the door and knock (Rev. 3:20).*
