Ask yourself: Can you sense where He is leading you today?
He isHis Sheep I am with you always (Matthew 28:20). You are with me (Psalm 23:4). He tends his flock like a shepherd: He gathers the lambs in his arms and carries them close to his heart; he gently leads those that have young (Isaiah 40:11). When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep
without a shepherd (Matthew 9:36). Ask yourself: Where are you most secure? Does knowing that you are close to the heart of the Savior add to your security?
The Good ShepherdThem Your rod and your staff, they comfort me (Psalm 23:4). NOTHING can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus. (Cf. Romans 8:38-39.) My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand (John 10:29).
Hefor His Sheep I shall not be in want (Psalm 23:1). Ask yourself: What needs have you that you can bring before the Lord today?
SHEEPS' JOB REQUIREMENTS
Sheep SeekFrom Shepherd. I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never go hungry, and he who believes in me will never be thirsty I am the living bread that came down from heaven. If anyone eats of this bread, he will live forever. This bread is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world (John 6:35, 51). Why spend money on what is not bread, and your labor on what does not satisfy? Listen, listen to me, and eat what is good, and your soul will delight in the richest of fare (Isaiah 55:2). Ask Yourself: What's in my diet? My heart diet? Am I heart-smart?
Sheepthe Shepherd My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me (John 10:27) Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is - his good, pleasing and perfect will (Romans 12:2). Ask yourself: Can you recognize the Shepherd's voice? It comes from listening to His voice (the Word), spending time with Him (worship, prayer, devotional meditation), and active trusting.
Sheep Obey andthe Shepherd My sheep follow me (John 10:27). Ask yourself: What makes it difficult or attractive to follow the Good Shepherd?
Sheepthe Shepherd. To all who did receive him, who believed in his name, he gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God (John 1:12-13).


Prayer Shawl Ministry
